

GRANTS

Here are some reminders and updates about Rotary grants:

Community assessments

Starting 1 July, clubs or districts that apply for a global grant to support a humanitarian project or a vocational training team will need to conduct a community assessment first and include the <u>results</u> in their grant application. Community assessments are the key to successful projects. They can help you find the most relevant opportunities for projects and maximize your impact. Make sure that Rotarians who are **planning global grant projects know about this requirement and its benefits. Clubs can review Rotary's** <u>Community Assessment Tools</u> to learn about proven, inexpensive methods for evaluating a community's assets and needs. These methods include community meetings, surveys, interviews, and focus groups.

Scholarship application due date - 30 June

Global grant applications for scholars who will begin studies in August, September, or October need to be submitted by 30 June.

Convention breakout sessions

We'll have two grant-related breakout sessions during the Rotary International Convention in Toronto, Ontario, Canada: Global Grants 101 and How to Conduct a Community Assessment. I'll speak and answer questions at Global Grants 101, and expert panelists will attend both sessions. Please encourage interested Rotarians in your district to attend.

Staff support for grants

Lastly, I want to remind you about one of the best resources for grant applicants — the <u>Rotary Grants staff</u>. Grants staff members, with their professional expertise, are poised to help applicants make sure their projects are eligible for funding. Staff can conduct a preliminary application review or help sponsors redesign projects to meet Foundation requirements. To request a preliminary review, contact your grant officer or write to <u>grants@rotary.org</u>.

Former First Lady Laura Bush to speak at Rotary convention



2018 ROTARY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION TORONTO, CANADA JUNE 23 - 27



Former First Lady of the United States Laura Bush, an advocate for literacy,

education, and women's rights, will speak at the 2018 Rotary Convention in Toronto this June. For decades Mrs. Bush has fought for key national and global issues including launching groundbreaking education and healthcare programs in the U.S. and abroad.

She founded both the Texas Book Festival and the National Book Festival in Washington D.C. As chair of the **Women's Initiative at the George W. Bush Institute.**

Mrs. Bush continues her work on global healthcare innovations, empowering women in emerging democracies, education reform, and supporting men and women who have served in the U.S. military.

Women's healthcare also has been a central issue for Mrs. Bush. Because heart disease is the leading cause of death among American women, she partnered with the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute to launch The Heart Truth campaign and Red Dress project. The Heart Truth raises awareness among women about their risk for heart disease.

Mrs. Bush is the author of the bestselling memoir, *Spoken From the Heart*, and bestselling children's book, *Our Great Big Backyard*. She serves on several boards including the National Advisory Board for the Salvation Army, the Council for the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture, the Board of Trustees for the National Trust for Historic Preservation, and the Southern Methodist University Board of Trustees.




