
But keeping Rotary to ourselves has a cost. and by sharing our Rotary moments, we are being generous with others and giving them an opportunity to understand the impact of Rotary.

Rotary Club of Antigua Sundown – End Polio Now Awareness walk 2022



In observance of World Polio Day on October 24, 2022, the Rotary Club of Antigua Sundown held its End Polio Now Awareness Walk. The Walk was held on Saturday 22 October 2022 to show solidarity for Rotary International promise to eradicate polio.

At 4:00pm Rotarians along with family and friends all dressed in their End Polio Now jerseys, embarked on a 3 mile walk along a busy route in St John's.

The Club is working diligently to ensure that its commitment to the District Polio Fund is realized. There is another fundraiser planned for Jan 2023.



Rotary Club of Antigua Sundown's Literacy Project



Rotary Club of Antigua Sundown together with the Rotary Club of Bethlehem Morning Star in Bethlehem Pennsylvania, were able to get a Reading Specialist Dr Matz to visit and make preliminary assessments on three primary schools in Antigua.

Dr. Matz identified that there were weaknesses in phoneme development and would be willing to train the Reading and Kindergarten Teachers. The Clubs have partnered to purchase the Heggerty Curriculums for the Schools, and this will be used in conjunction with the Jolly Phonic program to aid the kindergarten students in letter sound development.

The training materials were presented on October 8, 2022. The Teachers were trained virtually by the Reading Specialist on October 12&13.

Empower Girls Now Wellness Weekend



The Rotary Club of Garden City on Saturday, October 15, and Sunday, October 16, 2022, launched its signature project of the year – "Empower Girls Now Wellness Weekend".

The Wellness Weekend focused on revealing the full potential of girls to shape the future of their communities, eliminate or appropriately deal with obstacles they face and create social awareness of the concept #EmpowerGirlsNow under our theme of "Empowered Girls become Empowered Women". This was done in association with a selected group of twenty young ladies aged 13–17 years old from the Guyana Girl Guides Association and, in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of the University of Guyana – who were onboard to help guide the girls through their group activities.



I-Syi Girls Empowerment Project.



On September 21st the formal signing took place of the agreement between the Rotary Club of Paramaribo Residence and the A.L. Waaldijkcollege for the execution of the I-Syi Girls Empowerment Project.

I-Syi means 'Did you see' in the Surinamese language

At least 45 girls will be trained to use a sewing machine and to manufacture environmental-friendly and reusable cotton bags (and in a later stage other items) with cultural print and the I-Syi brand name.

The bags will be sold with the assistance of RCPR and the sales proceeds will flow to the participating girls and will enable them to buy their own sewing machine. With this project RCPR aims to empower disadvantaged girls to be self-reliant by providing the means: training, material and 40 sewing machines donated to the A.L. Waaldijkcollege.













Interact Environmental Project – Green Spaces & Happy Places



The Rotaract Club of Grenada Completes Major Community Service Project called Hooked on Books!



The Rotaract Club of Grenada unveils three Little Free Libraries and revamps primary school library.

November 7, 2022, The Rotaract Club of Grenada (RCOG) installed and formally unveiled three Little Free Libraries in three immensely frequented areas in the parish of St. George: Quarantine Point Recreational Park, Tanteen Playground and Camerhogne Park on Monday September 26th 2022; and successfully renovated the library room of its adopted school– The Mt. Moritz Anglican Primary School.

The first phase of this project commenced with a book drive which yielded over 500 books due to the generosity of the public. The second phase entailed the erection of the Little Free Libraries which involved the participation of Rotarians, club members and members of the public.







Rotary District 7030: The New Generations Service Exchange Experience From District 4621 In Brazil



In Rotary Year 2019–2020, our District held its first New Generations Service Exchange (NGSE), a service and professional exchange for young adults aged 18–30.
